<u>Targets</u> Targets are based on prior attainment and are prescribed from KS2 attainment.

Estimated Grades

Estimated grades are a professional judgement of the grade a student will achieve by the end of year 11 and is based on classroom assessments and pre-public examinations. Estimated grades can increase and decrease during years 10 and 11.

Numbers

In 2017, the government introduced a number-based grading system for GCSEs. The system goes from 9 -1. The conversion from the letters grades previously awarded to the number grades can be seen below.
