- Keep a self-care routine so that your revision is the most productive it can be whilst you feel as good as possible.
- If you feel nervous about the time pressure of an exam, practice timing yourself when you revise, or try some test papers.
- 5. Break up revision with food and exercise to make sure you stay energised.

# UNIVERSITY OF HERTFORDSHIRE SCIENCE SUMMER SCHOOL, JUNE 2019

The Department of Clinical and Pharmaceutical Sciences, School of Life and Medical Sciences, at the University of Hertfordshire are running a series of Science Summer School days from 10-13th June 2019. We would like to invite Year 12 students to apply to attend one of these days. The event is free of charge. We particularly welcome applications from students who are thinking of applying to study science related degrees.

The number of places will be limited to 50 per day and will be allocated on a first come first serve basis; we therefore would encourage an early application by individual students or groups who may be accompanied by their teachers. Students coming on their own will require an authorization letter or an e-mail from their Head of Science or Form Tutor (email to Dr Paul Bassin at j.p.bassin@herts.ac.uk) confirming their attendance.

The programme for the day is as follows:

9.00-9.30 Arrival in New Science Building foyer
9.30-10.30 Microbiology laboratory (1J026): The students will learn about aseptic techniques and quantification of living bacterial cells through an exercise on diluting and sulturing different food complex. The experimental results will be

diluting and culturing different food samples. The experimental results will be discussed as a group, including an appreciation of the impact of bacterial

contamination levels found in different food types.

10.30-11.30 Pharmaceutics laboratory (3J001 and 3J002): The session will comprise a demonstration of the tablet manufacturing process using a bench-top single punch tablet press. The students will then conduct tests on the manufactured tablets (friability testing) to give an indication of how resistant the tablets would be to the abrasion and shock experienced in manufacturing, packing and

shipping operations.

11.30-12.30 Pharmacology laboratory (Pharmacology floor): In this Pharmacology practical,

students will learn about quantification of drug potency and efficacy through a computer simulation exercise diluting drug concentration and applying different drug concentrations to a 'biological tissue'. The experimental results will be discussed as a group, resulting in an appreciation of how drug potency and efficacy is quantified and the value of computer simulations in replacement

science.

12.30-14.00 Lunch (£5 lunch voucher will be provided which the students can spend at any UH food outlet on campus except SUBWAY)

After lunch students will be split into two groups

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14.00-15.00 Guided tour of instrumentation labs in the new science building

15.00-16.00 Speed meeting: the students will have an opportunity to talk in a one-to-one

with researchers (PhD and Post-Doctoral students) and staff members

regarding science career paths/studying at universities etc.

14.00-15.00 Speed meeting: the students will have an opportunity to talk in a one-to-one

## Big Voice London

Big Voice London is a youth charity supported by, but independent from, the UK Supreme Court, which aims to help young people engage with the law and legal policy.

They are currently taking applications from A-Level students for places at three upcoming projects, namely:

1. Introduction to the Legal System Project: 6 June - 8 July 2019, every Thursday between 6-8pm. Location: University of Law, Moorgate.

The Introduction to the Legal System programme will give students a chance to look at the case of Stocker v Stocker [2019] UKSC 17, which was recently heard in the Supreme Court. Participants will review the decision made by the court, before coming to their own conclusions and writing a report outlining their thoughts and giving their own judgments. The project will also give the participants the opportunity to learn about the work of the Supreme Court - the highest court in England and Wales - and to engage with cutting edge legal policy, while at the same time learning about the role of our legal system more broadly. This is also a fantastic opportunity to meet leading lawyers, learn new research, critical thinking and presentation skills.
