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i. The basics and expectations

Hopefully you have chosen Health and Social Care as you have an interest in a subject which affects your everyday lives.

The basics: We all use health and social care services throughout our lives. Are you a caring person? Do you want to follow a career where you help others?

This course is for people who want to follow a career in health and social care. It is not suitable for those who want to work with children. There are aspects of child development that we study but this is not a childcare course.

Are you aware of the different types of jobs in health and social care? Do you know about the organisations that provide these services and the responsibilities of those who work in this sector?

To 'care' for a person involves demonstrating variety of different things. It is important that those in our care are safe from any dangers or hazards. This will keep them safe from physical danger but a care provider also has responsibility for an individuals emotional safety. Do they feel secure in their environment? Do they trust the people around them?

The expectations

Health and social care is a subject that continues to change, it is a forward looking subject. It is a subject that requires writing in context. You cannot rely only on your text book. To be successful you will need to show:

- 1. Awareness of health and social care in the real world via media news sources
- 2. An ability to conduct independent research
- 3. Show logical chains of argument. Don't jump steps, link them in your answers

In January 2021 you will sit an exam. This will be for Unit 2 – Working in Health and Social Care. As part of this you need to have knowledge of the roles and responsibilities of specific jobs in health and social care.
