

Dear Parents/Carers,

Once again, we come to the end of the week and would like to update you on both how this week has gone and also our plans for the remaining weeks of this term. Before we do this, we would like to once again thank you for playing your part in supporting your children and the school, the messages of support have been very welcome and mean a lot to all of us.

As expected, this week was another tough one with significant numbers of staff not in school, having Year 10 and Year 8 studying at home certainly made it manageable., thank you for your understanding. At the end of last week, we were worried that we may see our numbers of positive cases rising, whilst we have had a small number of positive cases this week we have not seen any increase or wider spread, for which we are thankful for.

Next week looks better in terms of staff in school, as a number return from self-isolation. However we are not at the point where we feel that we can provide a quality education to all year groups, so again, we have concluded that we require a year group to remain at home, this is not a decision we have taken lightly. As we do not know what the remaining weeks of this term will look like, we are planning on the basis that a year group will need to remain at home each day. In order to minimise the impact on specific years groups we are planning to include all year groups from Year 7 to Year 11 in a rota system.

To enable you to plan ahead and to give you as much notice as possible, we are publishing the rota for the final three weeks of this term. If our staffing situation improves to the point where all students can be in school, we will of course revert back to all students being in school. We will keep you informed on a weekly basis. We understand that this may present difficulties for some families, especially as our younger students are included in the rota. If this is the case or if your child is entitled to free school meals and you would like some support with this please do contact the school in advance so that we can see how we may be able to help.

On Friday 18th December we are keen for all of our students to be in school so that they do not miss out to the traditional Christmas activities, this year our Panto will be online and we are planning a number of Christmas related activities - all socially distanced of course.

Monday 30th November the Year 11 students will not return to school as planned, but we are asking that they remain at home and revise for their mock exams that begin next week, no work will be set by subject teachers.

All other year groups on subsequent days will have work set via email from their subject teacher for the day they are at remaining home.

Free School Meals

Hertfordshire County Council is teaming up with the Family Food Trust, a government backed charity, to help them to deliver food vouchers to children and young people in receipt of free school meals during the winter school holidays. This follows recent government announcements of the COVID-19 Winter Grant Scheme, part of this funding will be allocated to providing food vouchers to entitled families this Christmas holiday and in February 2021 half-term.

A total of £30 per entitled child will be provided for the Christmas holidays (10 days) and £15 per child for the February 2021 half-term (5 days). Families will receive support for each of these holidays separately, before the end of each term.

The electronic vouchers for food and groceries can be used in four major supermarkets (Asda, Morrisons, Tesco and Sainsbury's) and will be sent to families directly by email or if necessary, they can be printed, and collected from school.

The school, Hertfordshire County Council and the Family Food Trust will need to access and share personal data of pupils and students who are entitled to free school meals to enable us to provide food vouchers directly to eligible families. This data will include the name and contact details of each pupil/student and parent/carer and the name of the School they attend. All information shared will be used solely for the purpose of distributing food vouchers; no personal information will be shared with any other partner or third party, and data will only be retained for the length of time of the food voucher support offer. Data will be stored and transferred securely from your school to Hertfordshire County Council and then to the Family Food Trust. **Please ensure the School has your up to date contact details.**

Reporting COVID cases

During the term, it is essential that we as a school are notified of any students that test positive for COVID-19 or have to self-isolate as they have been in close contact to a confirmed case.

If your child tests positive for coronavirus at any point, please notify us as soon as possible so we can complete the relevant tracking and tracing process with public health and notify any other children or staff who have been close contacts and need to self-isolate. During school hours, you should phone the school, and out of school hours, it is necessary to email <u>communication@barnwell.herts.sch.uk</u>.

Remember as soon as your child or any member of your household develops symptoms, they must start selfisolating immediately and book a test.

Main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell
 or taste different to normal

If you are not sure whether symptoms suggest that they have coronavirus or an everyday cough or cold, you can consult this online NHS symptom checker: <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/</u>

Please do not send children back to school if any of the following apply:

- they have symptoms of COVID-19
- they, any members of your household, or any close contacts (including extended family or friends they have seen and bubbles at half-term activities and sports clubs) have tested positive for COVID-19
- they have not completed the full 14-day isolation period requested
