

Dear Parents/Carers

It has certainly been another eventful week, at least now we have some clarity and consistency for this half term. Boris Johnson announced that schools should remain closed until further notice, except for children of critical workers and our most vulnerable children. Moreover, schools will only re-open when the scientific advice indicates that it is right to do so.

We also know that GCSE and A Level exams are cancelled, we await to hear how centre assessed grades will be awarded.

As you will be aware our remote education is provided by live Microsoft Teams lessons with further resources being made available through SMHW. This has started for all year groups, thank you for your kind words and positive feedback. If you are having any teething problems or trouble accessing the lessons, please do email communication@barnwell.herts.sch.uk we are here to help.

This is still a steep learning curve for everyone and we fully appreciate the part you are playing to ensure your child/ren are engaged in learning.

We have our in-school provision up and running for Critical worker and Vulnerable students. The definition of vulnerable has been widened to include students who do not have a suitable environment to study in at home or who do not have suitable IT resources at home. From next week we will be starting weekly phone calls to parents just to see if there is anything else that we can do to support you or your child.

Thank you to the parents who offered their help with the mass testing, obviously this will not be going ahead at the moment, but when we know the plans for after half term we will be back in touch. We have set up weekly testing for our Key worker and Vulnerable students as well as testing for all staff, we have capacity to run this with school staff at the moment.

We would still like you to consider consenting to testing, as it is likely that this will form part of the return to school, the consent form can be accessed on **this link**

If your employment situation has changed recently you may be entitled to claim Free School meals.

Hertfordshire County Council could save you over £400 in school meals every year. If you receive one of the following benefits, then you could be eligible for free school meals worth over £400 per child per year.

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Child Tax Credit (providing you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- Support under Pat VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:



- younger than the compulsory age for starting school
- in full time education

During School closures families entitled to free school meals can receive a meal kit each week please complete this form to order your pack which can be collected from school.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they will remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they are in on 31 March 2022. To apply, or for more information, visit www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals

Below is a roundup of information and resources that you may find useful:

DEPARTMENT FOR EDUCATION UPDATE - YEAR 11 AND 13

Earlier this week, Gavin Williamson, Education Secretary, announced that GCSE and A Level examinations would be cancelled for all Year 11 and 13 students in the summer examination series of 2021. The Education Secretary told the Commons there would be "training and support" for teachers in predicting grades, "to ensure these are awarded fairly and consistently" and to make sure they are not disadvantaged in their progress to sixth form, college, university, apprenticeships, training or work because of these unprecedented conditions.

He added that details of exactly how results will be decided will be "fine-tuned in consultation with Ofqual, the exam boards and teaching representative organisations".

As the grades for qualifications will be based on evidence from student work, it is essential that all students actively engage with live lessons and the remote work set by teachers.

What about BTEC and CTEC qualifications?

As you will be aware, planned January Vocational examinations continue to be a topic being debated in the national press.

The Department for Education has stated: "No student will be disadvantaged if they can't take their exam or assessment or decide that they don't want to".

Pearson (BTECs) have stated: "Learners unable to take their assessment this January may be able to take their assessment at a later date. If that is not possible, we will put in place arrangements to ensure no learner is disadvantaged".

OCR (Cambridge Technicals) have stated: "There may be an opportunity to take their assessment at a future date. If this is not possible due to arrangements still to be announced for this summer, we will work with the DfE and Ofqual to make sure they are treated fairly."

As a school, given the pressures and anxiety that many students will currently be experiencing about the fact that they are facing sitting public examinations during a nationwide lockdown, we feel that it is likely to be in the best interests of most students **to not attend their exams**, given the assurances that they will still be awarded the grade that they deserve. If any students feel strongly that they would like to sit their exam, please contact Miss Townsend (m.townsend@barnwell.herts.sch.uk) by 3pm Monday 11th January, and we will discuss this further.

We hope that this goes some way to alleviate the stress and pressure that students are under and allows them to give their full attention to their remote learning, which it is essential that they continue to engage with.

With regards to summer vocational examinations, we are awaiting further guidance.



LIVE LESSONS AND SCHOOLWORK UPDATE

To ensure our live lessons run smoothly we ask that your child is fully prepared with all of the relevant equipment and it would be fantastic if your child could layout their books and resources for the day ahead each morning. We will still be setting work via SMHW, it is important that your child checks this platform regularly and completes the tasks as directed by their teacher.

A reminder that if your child's teacher is unwell during the national lockdown period they will not be delivering live lessons, however work will still be uploaded to Google classroom for completion and where possible the department will look to rearrange and support their colleagues by delivering other teachers' lessons on their behalf.

ACCESSING LIVE LESSONS USING CONSOLES

There have been several reports in the media that students are able to access school resources such as Microsoft Office applications and Teams through their Xbox or PlayStation consoles. We can confirm that this is the case and may help families with the distribution of devices to support home learning.

Instructions for console use are as follows:

Xbox online learning

- Power on your Xbox and wait for the home screen to become visible.
- (Optional) Plug a keyboard into the Xbox's USB slot.
- Hit the glowing Xbox logo button in the centre of the controller and select "My Games and Apps".
- Find and select "Microsoft Edge".
- Use the browser to type in the web address of your school's online learning platform

PlayStation 4 online learning

- Power on your PlayStation and wait for the home screen to become visible.
- Head to the content area the horizontal row of large icons used to launch games and applications.
- Scroll to the right until you come across the Internet Browser (a www icon with dots around it) and select it.
- Use the browser to type in the web address of your school's online learning platform.
