# Headteacher update - 8



## Dear Parents/Carers

Well we have made it to the end of a very different, but positive, half term. Students and staff have adapted to the new expectations and it has been business as usual with regards to teaching, learning and student progress.

Just to add to the excitement this week we had a 'fact finding' visit from Ofsted yesterday. We were randomly selected as part of a national sample. This was not an inspection but an opportunity for Ofsted to collect evidence about how Covid-19 has impacted on schools and how schools are adapting to manage in the current circumstances.

Two inspectors joined us for part of the day and we were able to inform them of everything we have been doing. In due course we will receive a letter confirming their visit, this is a pre-populated standardised letter that will provide simple factual information about the school. We will of course share it when we receive it.

Whilst the inspectors were not able to comment or make judgements directly on the work that the school has been doing, they were very complimentary about the school and our provision.

As stated last week, we have been reviewing the way we operate, and we will be slightly amending our systems and structures after half term. The main changes affect the middle campus, we have explained the changes to the students during virtual assemblies today and these are explained below.

Could we please ask you and your families to do their part over half term in ensuring our community remains safe and our school continues to operate. Please follow Government guidelines and reinforce school expectations at home.

#### **Reporting COVID cases during half term**

During half term, it is essential that we as a school are notified of any students that test positive for COVID-19 or have to self-isolate as they have been in close contact to a confirmed case.

If your child tests positive for coronavirus at any point during half-term, please notify us as soon as possible so we can complete the relevant tracking and tracing process with public health and notify any other children or staff who have been close contacts and need to self-isolate. During half-term you should email <u>communication@barnwell.herts.sch.uk</u>. Please do not call the normal absence line as this will not be covered during half-term.

## Remember as soon as your child or any member of your household develops symptoms, they must start selfisolating immediately and book a test.

## Main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

## Please do not send children back to school if any of the following apply:

- they have symptoms of COVID-19
- they, any members of your household, or any close contacts (including extended family or friends they have seen and bubbles at half-term activities and sports clubs) have tested positive for COVID-19
- they have not completed the full 14-day isolation period requested

### Timings of the school day

To further improve our COVID measures and to minimise contact between year group bubbles, we have slightly amended the timings of the school day for after half term.

- DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) will be at a fixed time in the day to add consistency and also to allow the opportunity for pastoral assemblies and other key activities to have an allocated time slot.
- Year 7 and 9 will have their break and lunch at the same time. There will be separate dining areas and social areas. Year 8 will have their own break and lunch time.
- Break time will be extended on both campuses and lunch on upper will be extended. This will allow staff and students, that are travelling, more time to get to the right place in plenty of time.

#### **G Block line-up**

At times during the first half term, G block has been congested with students leaving classes and others waiting to enter whilst the teacher is cleaning and preparing the classroom. We are therefore going to adopt a lining up system outside of the block. Students will have designated line up positions and the teacher will collect them for the lesson. The line up process will be supervised by a member of the senior leadership team.

#### Year 7 and 8 Learning partners

After half term, students in year 7 and 8 classes will remain in the same classes as they have been so far. We will however be removing learning partners and individual teachers will be organising seating plans that best suit the learning activities in the class.
