Dear Parents/Carers

We hope you had the opportunity for some well-deserved family time during the half term break. This week, students and staff have returned refreshed and ready to continue the outstanding work in ever changing circumstances. As we enter another lockdown phase, we wanted to reassure you that as a school, we are doing everything we can to ensure the environment is COVID safe and that we safeguard all students and staff.

In our last letter, we informed you of the 'fact finding' visit from Ofsted. We have now seen a draft of the prepopulated standardised letter that provides simple factual information about the school. It will be published on 18th November.

Our amended timings and systems have worked well this week and has further enhanced the calm and orderly movement of students around our site.

As ever, could we please ask you and your families to do their part in ensuring our community remains safe and our school continues to operate fully. Please follow Government guidelines and reinforce school expectations at home.

Reporting COVID cases

During the term, it is essential that we as a school are notified of any students that test positive for COVID-19 or have to self-isolate as they have been in close contact to a confirmed case.

If your child tests positive for coronavirus at any point, please notify us as soon as possible so we can complete the relevant tracking and tracing process with public health and notify any other children or staff who have been close contacts and need to self-isolate. During school hours, you should phone the school, and out of school hours, it is necessary to email communication@barnwell.herts.sch.uk.

Remember as soon as your child or any member of your household develops symptoms, they must start self-isolating immediately and book a test.

Main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If you are not sure whether symptoms suggest that they have coronavirus or an everyday cough or cold, you can consult this online NHS symptom checker: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/

Please do not send children back to school if any of the following apply:

- they have symptoms of COVID-19
- they, any members of your household, or any close contacts (including extended family or friends they have seen and bubbles at half-term activities and sports clubs) have tested positive for COVID-19
- they have not completed the full 14-day isolation period requested

REMINDER: Face Mask update

Face masks are now required by the government for all staff and students when in indoor social areas and travelling between lessons in our buildings. To further enhance our COVID safe environment, when teachers or teaching assistants move outside their 2m teaching zone, we will insist that students must put their masks on/up for this short period of time.

Please can you ensure your child has two face masks with them at all times, in case one breaks. We would advise students to wear reusable face masks and that they are washed on a daily basis.

Whilst we would never deny a student the issuing of a mask, there are too many children arriving without them and we cannot continue to bear the extra costs. Continued failure to comply with this request will result in students being issued a concern, and if the situation continues we may need to charge. We are seriously hoping we can avoid this.
