LAST FEW WEEKS AND INTO THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR

The news of a relaxing of lockdown and the many headlines in the press speculating on what schools should be doing has certainly increased anxiety levels amongst students, parents/carers and staff. We would like to reassure our community that we are working to put a comprehensive plan in place to support transition and a return to a full provision in the new academic year. Official government guidance on expectations will not be announced until next week, but we are confident that the plans we are formulating will be able to be continually shaped to have the best interests of all parties moving forward.

Transition – Year 6 into 7

Mr Reavell has been in constant communication with primary schools during lockdown and has put together a full programme of activities and events in line with what we would normally offer to students and parents/carers joining us in September. The website is updated regularly with transition documents, videos and virtual tours to help students with the transition process.

Transition – Year 9 into 10

Option subjects have been setting transition work and we are please to report that engagement levels are very high, despite the extended lockdown and hot weather. The academic review meetings will further enhance this provision in the next few weeks and will provide support for students as the transition into Year 10. Mr Launay and Mr Neocleous have sent video updates, are preparing one for the final week of term and are looking at trying to organise a face-to-face opportunity before the end of term.

Transition – Year 11 into 12

It is with great pleasure that we can inform you that student numbers returning to our 6th form continue to increase. Mrs Johnson and Mrs Chapman have put a comprehensive transition programme in place that can be accessed via our website.

Years 7 and 8

We are conscious that alongside form tutor phone calls and regular feedback from teachers, Year 7 and 8 students need to feel reassured about the end of term, summer break and the start of the new academic year. Miss Hull is working with heads of college to attempt to provide face-to-face opportunities for our Year 7 and 8 students before the end of term. More information on these plans will be distributed asap.

September

As explained previously, as a school we are still awaiting formal guidance from the government on what is to be expected when we fully return to school. All we can say at this stage is that we continue to strive to ensure the best provision possible is in place for our students and that we maintain a safe environment for both staff and students. As soon as we know more and have a completed plan, we will inform students and parents/carers.

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ACADEMIC REVIEWS – YEAR 9 AND YEAR 10

Despite a few technical glitches, we are pleased to announce that the initial online face-to-face student reviews with subject teachers for students in year 10 have been a success.

A reminder for all Year 10 students that they must check their email and accept the meeting. Once this has been done, the meeting will appear in their Outlook calendar and in their Microsoft Teams calendar. At the time of the meeting, students should open the appointment and click join the meeting.

Could we please remind students that for a full experience, the device must have a camera and microphone. A smartphone or tablet is ideal for this.

If students do have issues connecting, please email Mrs Lewis and their teacher and a new appointment or a phone call will be made.

The purpose of the meetings (max 10 minutes) will be for Year 10 option subject teachers to touch base with their students in a face-to-face way, ensuring they are happy with the work and to provide guidance on what steps they need to take to continue to make progress through to the end of term.

The meetings will be conducted through our secure Microsoft School Teams application and will only require students to access a mobile phone, tablet, laptop or PC. No specific equipment will be required.

The reason we will be using Microsoft Teams is that in the same way as we are conducting Year 12 live online tutorials, we are able to record that meetings for safeguarding purposes. All recordings will be deleted at the end of term.

The meetings will be held over an 8 working day period and the meetings will be able to be booked between 9am and 5pm, depending on teacher and student availability. Ideally, we would like parents involved in the meetings, but understand that this may not be possible due to other commitments.

The booking system is now live for Year 9 appointments, and protocols, instructions and expectations for the meetings will be distributed on Monday 29th June.

Please remember, this is a new system and we would appreciate it if parents and students could bear with us as we launch it for the very first time.

REMOTE LEARNING

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ONLINE RESOURCES

As we continue to support students with their online learning ahead of their return to school in September we would like to promote additional resources available to our students:

- The online classroom, [Oak National Academy](#), will stay open for another academic year, supported by the DfE. Resources will remain free and accessible to support high quality teaching in the classroom and minimise any disruption for students who are not able to attend.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Thanks to the amazing work of Marcus Rashford and many others, the government have agreed to provide additional funding for a COVID Summer Food Fund which will enable children who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals to claim vouchers for the 6 week holiday period. The school are already applying for this support and will be contacting individual families in due course.

KEY WORKER AND VULNERABLE CHILDREN SCHOOL PROVISION

The school will remain open through to the end of the summer term for vulnerable children and key worker children only. They receive funding from Hertfordshire County Council to provide counselling to young people who may be struggling with a variety of issues including anxiety, depression, family breakdown, bereavement, relationship issues, school refusal, self-harm, low self-esteem and bullying.
