
Good attendance at Barnwell means being in school at least 95% of the time = 181 school days.

Poor attendance means a lower chance of success


Very low attendance has a serious impact & limits chances


Good attendance at Barnwell means being in school, every day, and ready to learn.

Good punctuality at Barnwell means being in school, on time, every day, and ready to learn.







- If your child chooses SPORT, the PE Dept will assign them to either the BTEC or GCSE course depending on which one they are more likely to achieve greatest success on, depending on their individual strengths.



Guided Option Pathways

These pathways are comprised of subjects designed for students to study at a level and intensity best suited to their ability.

To decide the pathway a student will follow, we have considered their:

- Key Stage 2 prior attainment
- Current reading age
- Progress over time at Barnwell
- GCSE Target grades

Students will select two or three option subjects (depending on their pathway) from the range provided on their options form.





Are options 'first come, first served'?

- No. We wait until after the options deadline before we start organising the Year 10 timetable and classes.
- We strongly recommend you take the time to research all your options before submitting your final form.
- Do not hand your form in tonight.





Do I need to choose reserve options?

- Yes. We cannot guarantee you will receive your first-choice options and so you do need to choose 'back-up' options.
- We may need to use your reserve options if a course is undersubscribed and cancelled, if a course is oversubscribed or if the combination of subjects you have chosen cannot be coordinated on your Year 10 timetable.





Do I need to rank order my choices?

- Yes. The software we use to organise the option subjects for Year 10 prioritises your favourite subjects.
- We need you to rank your choices so we know which subjects you are most passionate about.






Can I change my options if I don't like them?

- The deadline for changing options at the start of Year 10 is mid-September.
- **Even then, we cannot guarantee that any changes will be possible.**
- It is very important to research your options thoroughly before you submit your choices on 11th February, as you will be studying your Key Stage 4 options for two years.





Will I be able to drop a subject during Year 10 or 11?

- No
- You will need to study the core curriculum and the option subjects you choose until the end of Year 11.
- There is a misconception that you can drop subjects.





When will I find out which options I have received?

- The options you have been allocated will be shared with you in June.
- If you have received a ‘reserve’ option, Mr Patching will speak to you beforehand.





What happens if I don't choose any options?

- Mr Patching picks them for you!
