


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Sixth Form Volunteering - A Case Study

The Empathy Project

In year 10 I had a careers meeting and during this meeting the careers advisor suggested that I investigate a programme called the 'Empathy Project' which operates at The Lister Hospital in Stevenage. At the time I didn't think much of it, it seemed interesting, but I didn't particularly have time or want to volunteer at that moment.

I was emailed the application form and completely forgot about it. After deciding that I wished to pursue a career as an adolescent neuropsychologist or psychological drama therapist I felt that applying for a role within this project would be interesting and I was excited to apply.




After completing my initial training I was told that I would be able to join the Empathy project, which is a programme that works to provide emotional support for adolescents, which is very similar to the career that I would like to pursue on completion of my A level studies. I am now volunteering for 8 hours per week. This is an amazing opportunity for me as it will give me the extremely valuable experience I will need to work with children.

More about the Empathy Project:

The YC Hertfordshire Empathy Project is a volunteering opportunity for young people in Hertfordshire. Nobody knows quite how a young person feels when they have to go to hospital in an emergency better than another young person. The Empathy Project enables young people aged 16 to 21 to volunteer as community navigators, administer social prescriptions and give emotional support to other young people attending A&E



What do Empathy Project volunteers do?

Empathy Project volunteers provide practical and emotional support to young patients in A&E, and ensure they leave with a clearer idea of the range of support and activities available to them in their community.

Volunteers are given extensive training and will receive recognised certificates in a range of subjects, including Mental Health First Aid and the Royal Society for Public Health's Emotional Wellbeing qualification.

Volunteers work in small groups of up to four people in Lister Hospital's A&E department and are supervised and chaperoned at all times by an experienced YC Hertfordshire youth worker.





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Sixth Form Achievements



On Tuesday 3rd of March, Holly and I visited GSK for their Twilight Tours along with Mrs Butterfield. We started with a talk by a man involved in the biocatalysis department at GSK, who told us about the work he does for GSK and the successful projects. We then moved on to taking tours around the site, touring through a biology and chemistry lab. We also visited a new lab that GSK added in for gene therapy. Throughout the tour, we were told about what all the different machines did in the organisation, how the scientists at GSK all worked together and we were told about all the different opportunities that are available at GSK, such as university placements and apprenticeships. I really enjoyed my experience on the Twilight Tours as those who work for GSK gave us lots of information about the type of project's they do there and what work life is like at GSK. The tours gave me a real insight into my future career in science and the places I can go in the pharmaceutical industry.







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School Closure Notification System



Hertfordshire County Council operate a Schools Closure Notification System for advising parents should schools have to close for any reason.

This system is operated by Everbridge and parents are able to register with Everbridge to receive emails and/or texts sent by schools.

Once registered parents can sign up for any school in Hertfordshire. To register please copy and paste the following link into your browser:

https://member.everbridge.net/index/892807736725489#/login

This link will direct you to the "Sign Up" page where you should click on the "sign up" button located at the top right hand side of the page on the black strip and from there follow the instructions. It should take no more than 5 minutes to register and you can edit your information should it change at any time.

Parents/carers are urged to sign up for this service as we will be contacting Everbridge as soon as a decision is made to close the school for whatever reason, such as heavy snow. The system will only be used for School Closures or other serious issues and is a supplement to information currently provided via the Herts Direct website and local radio stations.

Our website will also be updated regularly.

Each contact within the system can have 2 devices added for each communication type. This means that in addition to adding your own mobile number and email address, you could include the mobile number and email address of a partner or a grandparent in your registration process. They too would then receive any messages in relation to your school's closure.

Alternatively, interested parties could register themselves separately.

If you have children at more than one school you can register for those schools too in a single registration process by selecting all schools you have children at. Once you are signed up you will receive messages relating to the status of each selected school.

If you no longer want to receive messages sent by the school you can remove your registration details from the system by logging on to Everbridge and deleting your record.

Free School Meals

Your child could get a free school meal if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
