
Progression

It's come to that time when your Son/Daughter has been making decisions about the next phase in their education. Post 16 choices can be exciting but yet a confusing and anxious time.

Many young people....

- do not know what they want to do next
- do not want to leave the security of school
- do not want to be narrowed into a specific vocational pathway with another post 16 provider/college
- will not obtain the required GCSE grades to progress onto A Levels or level 3 programmes

Course Outline

This is a full time programme of 5 days per week in a partnership of four schools; Barclay, Barnwell, Marriotts and Nobel. Students will spend time in the Partnership Schools studying a variety of subjects such as:

- Enrichment activities










September 2018 - December 2018

Your son / daughter will be learning a range of subjects to support their academic and personal & social development mainly at Barnwell School. Two days per week students will study essential employability skills which is accredited with BTEC Workskills qualifications and recognised by employers. This will prepare them for the world of work and their chosen work placement.

<u>January 2019 – July 2019</u>

Your Son/Daughter will continue to study at school three days per week and will attend a work placement for two days in place of their 'employability skills lessons'. The work placement is matched specifically to their future career aspirations and/or interests.
