Course Description

Methods of Assessment

There are two core units, one is externally marked, and one is internally marked. All optional units are marked by staff and then moderated by an external moderator.

- CAPA 304E (Core unit) Performance Preparation (worth 30 credits and is the external unit)
- CAPA 306 (Core unit) Planning for a Career in the Creative and Performing Arts (worth 15 credits and is the internal unit)
- CAPA 307 (Optional unit) Acting for the Camera (15 credits)
- CAPA 310 (Optional unit) Approaches to Acting (15 credits)
- CAPA 311 (Optional unit) Audition Techniques Acting (15 credits)
- CAPA 313 (Optional unit) Contemporary Theatre (15 credits)
- CAPA 320 (Optional unit) Vocal Techniques Acting (15 credits)

Progression

Students can progress from this qualification to:

- Drama schools and university courses that relate directly to acting, drama, and theatre.
- University courses that benefit from skills acquired in this Extended Diploma, such as law, human resources, and people management.
- Employment where people skills are essential, for example management, retail, nursing, industry, and business environments.
- Employment where time management, confidence, collaboration, and meeting deadlines are desirable.
