

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Relationships and Sex Education Curriculum 2019

• The Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education and Health Education (England) Regulations 2019, made under sections 34 and 35 of the Children and Social Work Act 2017, make Relationships Education compulsory for all pupils receiving primary education and Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) compulsory for all pupils receiving secondary education.

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Why is RSE so important?

- Barnwell School believes that Relationship and Sex education [RSE] makes an essential contribution to every student's health, wellbeing and preparation for adult life in society. RSE is lifelong learning for all young people, irrespective of gender, ethnicity or ability, about physical, sexual, moral and emotional development. It is also about the teaching of sex, sexuality and sexual health.
- It does not promote sexual activity or any particular sexual orientation or gender identity. RSE is about the emotional, social and cultural development of pupils, and involves learning about relationships, sexual health, sexuality, healthy lifestyles, diversity and personal identity.
- RSE involves a combination of acquiring knowledge and information, sharing information, developing skills, and exploring issues, beliefs, attitudes and values.
- It is essential that young people develop the skills to enable them to take control over their own sexual health and entity and become responsible citizens who make well-informed decisions about their lives.

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Barnwell Pride Lessons


- Students in Year 7 to 11 currently have one Barnwell Pride lesson each fortnight.
- Next academic year we will be doubling this to one lesson each week in Year 7 and 8.
- These lessons cover all of the statutory PSHE and RSE Curriculum content.
- Students also cover some of the sex education content, mainly based around reproduction, in their science lessons.

- Parents have the right to withdraw their children from the '<u>Sex Education</u>' content of the Relationship and Sex Education statutory content in Barnwell Pride lessons
- Parents do not have the right to withdraw their children from the '<u>*Relationships*</u>' content.




