RSL Level 3 Extended Diploma in Creative and Performing Arts: Acting. Entry Requirements: Grade 5 in Drama and Grade 4 in English at GCSE Level

RSL CAPA Acting has a clear progression from the GCSE Drama course, with the study of seven units linked to performance, play texts and practitioners. Students will study a range of acting styles in detail, each one culminating in a performance assessment or vocational project. Students will produce evidence for each unit, demonstrating how performance skills have been explored and developed. Part of the course requires all students to see a live theatre performance and this will be organised by the department.


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
